

Cooperation Agreement on Implementation of Master Programmes

between National University of Kyiv-Mohyla Academy, Ukraine

and Vilnius University, Lithuania

(extracts)

Tuition Fees and Insurance

The students shall pay tuition fee at the Receiving Institution according to its requirements presented in Annex 4, unless the Parties agree otherwise. All charges related with travel, accommodation, etc., as well as health insurance, shall be covered by the student. The insurance against any incident and/or accident and/or any legal liability against damages, which the student may involuntarily cause to and/or suffer during his/her study period abroad, shall be subject to the local regulations applicable. Procedure and amount of the tuition fee in Sending Institution shall be subject to contract between student and the Sending Institution.

The students studying according to the Integrated Study Plan presented in Annex 1 shall pay tuition fee to the Receiving Institution before the beginning of a particular semester as follows:

The students of NaUKMA shall pay to VU the following tuition fees:

900 EUR (nine hundred Euros) for the semester at VU, i.e. the second semester under the Integrated Study Plan and

100 EUR (one hundred Euros) for the semester of preparation and defence of Master thesis, the third semester under the Integrated Study Plan.

Administrative and Academic Regulations

Throughout the study period at Receiving Institution the students are subject to the administrative and/or academic and/or other regulations of the Receiving Institution, including these concerning the attribution of an electronic mail address.

Integrated Study Plan

Study Plan for the Students of National University of Kyiv-Mohyla Academy In order to be awarded diploma of VU the students of NaUKMA shall spend second semester at VU as a substitute for the semester at NaUKMA, pass the study courses listed in the Integrated Study Plan and defend the Master Thesis before a joint commission.

Documents to be submitted to Vilnius University

The list of documents to be submitted:

- 1) Application form.
- 2) Official certified copy of the document confirming previous education including grades (an academic transcript) and English knowledge (see Annex 3) confirmed by the governmental authorities with a translation into English.
- 3) Copy of a passport or other document of identification with a translation into English.
- 4) Confirmation about acceptance to the Master Study Programme in Law at NaUKMA.
- 5) 2 recent passport size photos (3x4).

Criteria for Acceptance into the Master Study Programme International and European Union Law at VU

1. Students must have a Bachelor diploma in Law conforming to the admission rules and requirements of VU.
2. Students must be accepted into the Master Study Programme in Law at NaUKMA.
3. NaUKMA students must meet the English language requirements: the level not lower than B2 (according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) that shall be supported by evidence such as standardised proficiency tests (IELTS, etc.), previous studies in English language, studies of English language, articles written in English language, etc. If necessary, an on-line interview may be arranged.
